



Dear GAP/GHP Audit Participant:

This letter is to notify you of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture's GAP/GHP Cost-Share Program for the 2014 calendar year. Qualified applicants may receive up to a maximum of \$400 per year to cover the costs of *one* successful USDA Good Agricultural Practices (GAP), USDA Good Handling Practices (GHP) or USDA Mushroom specific GAP (MGAP) audit. Participation in the USDA GAP, GHP and MGAP audit program is voluntary. The cost share program is designed to help defray some of the costs related to a successful audit.

A business/individual is eligible to apply for reimbursement as soon as their USDA GAP GHP or MGAP audit has been approved. Applicants must fully complete the necessary application and be able to show verification of audit approval. Qualified applicants may only receive funding for one successful audit per calendar year. To qualify for reimbursement for 2014, applicants must have successfully completed an approved USDA audit on or between January 1, 2014 and December 31, 2014. Reimbursements will not be given for costs associated with a failed audit.

Applications are accepted and approved on a first-come, first-serve basis. Reimbursements will cover all costs associated with *one* successful USDA GAP, GHP or MGAP audit, up to a maximum of \$400. Costs exceeding \$400 are not eligible for reimbursement. The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture recommends that potential applicants apply for this funding as soon as their audit is approved and payment is verified. In the event of limited funds available, preference will be given to complete applications received with the earliest approval date. The final deadline for receiving applications for the 2014 cost-share program is January 31, 2015.
